### EXECUTIVE ORDER

**WHEREAS**, the City of Easton Ordinances, Article 503.01, provides for the Mayor the authority to implement ninety-day Executive Orders, and

**WHEREAS**, the hazards posed by individuals using the Karl Stirner Arts Trail for more than its intended uses of hiking, biking, and jogging or viewing the public artwork, and

**WHEREAS**, it is also known that jumping off the bridges along the KSAT is not only dangerous to the individuals but also created a severe liability hardship for the City; and activities other than those uses intended off eh KSAT can be harmful to the natural trout producing Bushkill Creek, and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Easton provides numerous pavilions that can be reserved by groups in some of the City parks,

**NOW THEREFORE** I, Salvatore J. Panto, Jr. do hereby declare a Ninety (90) Day Executive Order to provide for a safe and healthy environment along the Karl Stirner Arts TRAIL (KSAT) and therefore it shall be the policy of the City of Easton to prohibit coolers, amplified music, picnic activities, alcoholic beverages, littering, groups of more than 6 individuals, and jumping off of any object into the Bushkill Creek,

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that any person in violation of this Order can fined up to \$1,000 per day

**AND BE IT FURHTER RESOLVED** that this Executive Order will expire in 90 days with the hope that Easton City Council will have made it an official Ordinance of the City of Easton.
